



Social Dialogue & Management of Change: some key messages

- Transparency and mutual trust amongst the parties concerned
- Need of understanding the European and national regulatory framework
- Unique voice vis-à-vis the policy-makers
- Need to combine coordination and subsidiarity
- Need to merge continuity and innovation
- Need to flexibility [no "one fits all" approach, but choose the best solution for each context]
- □ Identify together the drivers of future energy policy.....and
- □ Importance of Anticipation: social partners need to look ahead now!



What come next

- From Lisbon strategy to entry into force of LisbonTreaty:
 10 years of progress for social Europe
 - Better mainstreaming of European social model principles in all the EU initiatives
 - Explore further way of cooperation at European level, national, business, local level: more partnerships and multilevel platforms needed

Analyse the potential of TFAs: lack of legal framework could undermine their effectiveness

Explore the potential of the OMC in social policies



EURELECTRIC Work Programme 2011 in Social Affairs

□ In the SSD:

- Follow-up past projects Joint Programme of actions based on our previous joint recommendations on Just Transition Policies to be implemented by Social Partners' respective affiliates at national and company levels.
- Participate actively to consultations of social partners on EC impact assessments (Energy Roadmap 2050) – Early involvement is key !
- Launch a new joint project financed by DG EMPL.

□ Internally:

- Participate in the CEEP project "Public Services Employers Forum"
- Follow developments at EU level having social implications for the electricity sector
- Address the social dimension of energy policies and organize appropriate follow-up.
